

**II ANIHO YOUNG RESEARCHERS' CONFERENCE – IV SHRA:
ANTIQUITY AND COLLECTIVE IDENTITIES: FROM THE MIDDLE AGES TO THE
CONTEMPORARY WORLD**

(21- 11-2018, Vitoria-Gasteiz, UPV/EHU)

This young researchers' conference arises from the synergy of two individual projects, the ANIHO-ANIWEH research project (<https://aniho.hypotheses.org/>) and the Seminario de Historiografía y Recepción de la Antigüedad (SHRA).¹ ANIHO-ANIWEH project analyses the use of Classical Antiquity in the different nation-building processes during the 19th and 20th centuries. The SHRA, for its part, is promoted by the Universidad Autónoma de Madrid and is designed to be a meeting point and a hub for PhD students concerned with the study of the legacy and reception of Antiquity, from historiography to art and political discourse. This fourth edition, as happened with the third, will be held in the context of a new seminar of the ANIHO-ANIWEH research project, which will be entitled *Antigüedad, progreso y cambio social: siglos XIX-XX (Antiquity, progress and social change: 19th and 20th centuries)*.

Under the title *Antiquity and collective identities: from The Middle Ages to the Contemporary World*, the II ANIHO Young Researchers' Conference – IV SHRA intends to analyse the role played by Classical Antiquity (but also Near Eastern and Protohistoric), in the political and cultural development of collective identities, both in the construction of modern nations and in the conception and definition of pre-national communities. In this regard, the conference will focus on the theme tackled by the ANIHO-ANIWEH project, but without limiting itself exclusively to the contemporary world. Consequently, proposals which deal with this use of Antiquity in Medieval and Modern times will also be accepted.

The meeting will take place on Wednesday, 21st November, at the Faculty of Arts of the University of the Basque Country, in Vitoria-Gasteiz (Spain). As aforementioned the II ANIHO Young Researchers' Conference – IV SHRA will be followed in the next two days (November,) by an International Seminar on *Antiquity, progress and social change: 19th and 20th centuries* on November 22nd and 23rd.
